

CPRS Atlantic Exploratory Committee Terms of Reference - Final

Mandate

 The CPRS Atlantic Exploratory Committee (AEC) is an ad hoc committee constituted to explore a co-managed Regional Society model and deliver a framework for a CPRS Atlantic Region pilot.

Objective

- The objective of the CPRS AEC is:
 - To build a strong community of professional communicators while testing a comanaged regional model that replaces four separate local societies with one regional society.
 - To use a combination of support from local society volunteers and National Office support to carry out CPRS activities in Atlantic Canada, and
 - To see if the lessons learned in Atlantic Canada will have broader application to local societies across Canada.

Goal

- The goal of the CPRS AEC is:
 - To improve service delivery to CPRS members in Atlantic Canada by becoming more efficient and sustainable at delivering volunteer committee support, and
 - To ensure the success of local societies efforts resulting in a strong local membership in Atlantic Canada.

Accountability

 The CPRS AEC is accountable to the CPRS National Board of Directors and the CPRS membership in Atlantic Canada.

Chair and Committee Membership

- Wayne Knorr, APR, CPRS national board member and interim president of CPRS-NB will serve as the CPRS AEC chair.
- Membership will constitute two CPRS members from each province in Atlantic Canada. Every effort will be made to create a committee with diverse interests and backgrounds encompassing demographics, work sectors, language, and experience in the field of public relations and communications.

- Members will participate in meetings via conference call and address issues between meetings by email.

Staff Role/Responsibilities

- The CPRS AEC requires staff involvement.
- Staff involvement will include providing information, identifying available resources and logistical support to track action items arising from meetings, polling and setting meeting dates and arranging conference calls.

Meetings and Time Commitment

- The committee will meet as required, but at a minimum two times a month until the end
 of December 2018 is expected in the short-term.
- Expected time commitment from members is a maximum of 4-6 hours of work each month, in addition to the two hour-long meetings, for a total of a maximum of 8 hours per month.

Reporting Requirements

- Notes of all meetings should be kept and include action items including to whom they are assigned and completion dates.
- If the assigned staff support is unable to record notes the Chair will call for a volunteer.
- The CPRS AEC will report to the National Board.
- The committee will provide the CPRS National Board of Directors with a
 recommendation regarding the pilot, that includes a framework document, as well as a
 proposed CPRS Atlantic Board of Directors roster for the implementation of the
 recommendations.
